This spread would not increase any higher throughout the match as the lead swapped back and forth. It was tied at 50 shoes, 27 all. Buddy would prevail in the down and back with 4 points. 



## New Pitching Division, ELDER WOMEN

The Elder Women's Division inclusion was a rule change at the last World NHPA Membership Meeting.

**Elder Women** (become eligible to pitch in the Elders Division upon purchase of an NHPA card dated for the calendar year that they become sixty-five (65) years old) Elder Women may pitch from any place on either the extended or full distance platforms and shall observe the twenty foot (20') foul line.

We don't currently have any "Elder Women' on our roster but there may be some interest in the future.

## Old School Stories

Millville legend, Britt Sanders, relays an old school story from a Millville Horseshoe Tournament when a player by the name of Joe Rice Sr. was winning his match handily until someone approached Rice, and asked him if he knew who he was pitching? He said "No, Who?" They informed him he was pitching against the State Champion, Howard Hamilton! Rice never scored another point and lost the match! (About 1970.)

## KHPA LOGO HISTORY

Let's Take a look at various logos used Throughout the history of the KHPA. This old School horseshoe on state logo (right), was used in some of the KHPA's earliest newsletters, In 1970-1972. Jake Jacobs recalls that this logo was likely created by a lady named Barbara Burch. Jake says she helped type up and copy those early newsletters and was very creative. In the 1990's and early 2000's this logo was used on league shirts, worn by the Millville horseshoe club.



This simple horseshoe with interior wording was used During the mid to late 1970's and reappeared in use during the late 1980's. This logo and the ringers/stake logo was sometimes used in the same publication during the late 80's. Used by John Hankins.



This unique and interesting "k" logo was used on all official KHPA newsletters in 1981 and early into 1982. Joe Minnich was Secretary/Treasurer during this time frame.



This horseshoes, stake and lettering combination was used for the remainder of 1982. This model was adjusted to the horseshoes, stake and lettering now in the round circle around the stake, seen at right. This adjusted logo was used throughout publications from 1983-1985 but both logos would also reappear at various times through 1990.





This "court" style logo was created by Randy Hankins. It appears to have been used sparingly. It appears on info and stat books from 1992-1995.

The logo to the right was created by Robert Taylor in 1999 and has been used Consistently In the KHPA for the last 25 years. It has been seen in newsletters, on shirts, the website, round robin cards, and other KHPA materials.





The KHPA logo was upgraded with a nice wrap provided by Ronnie Meredith in 2024, using KHPA colors and our earliest known State Championship tournament date. It was also used on all 2024 materials in 2024 and beyond.

As a fun little quirk to keep our trophies interesting, I may include one Of these retros logo in the trophies at our one of our oldest sites such As Millville. Used sparingly, it can make that trophy hard to win!
